SUMMER WORSHIP PREVIEW

This summer, IPC will again be joining with our neighbors next door at St. Barnabas Episcopal Church for worship. All shared services will begin at 9 a.m. and childcare will be provided each week.

IPC will host on June 30, July 7, July 14, July 21, and July 28.

St. Barnabas will host on August 4, August 11, August 18, August 25, and September 1.

During the month of July, Rev. Crawford will be participating in a pulpit exchange program with a colleague in the Church of Scotland, Rev. Calum Stark. Rev. Stark will lead worship at IPC during the month of July, while Rev. Crawford will lead worship at the Avendale and Drumclog Church in Strathaven, Scotland. Rev. SUMMER CONSTRUCTION OVERVIEW

This summer, the church will continue its work addressing water damage and drainage issues. Summer construction will include three major components:

- 1) Completion of Playground Pathway and Drainage.
- 2) Removal of five stain-glass windows from the parlor and sanctuary to be restored, repaired, and re-installed at a later date.
- 3) Installing new drainage pipes and re-grading in three areas:
 - a) Around the manse, specifically in the back yard to prevent future flooding in the playground area, but also to prevent future basement flooding.
 - b) On the north side of the church, running along Matthiessen Park.
 - c) In the courtyard area which provides access to the Church Office door, the Chapel door, and one of the Good Shepherd classrooms.

Construction will begin shortly after the end of the Good Shepherd school year on June 14th (Good Shepherd will not be running its summer program, allowing for a longer window to complete the work). We hope the work to be completed before Good Shepherd is back in session in September.

Regarding the stained-glass repair, the windows will temporarily be replaced with painted plywood and will be re-installed after work on the mortar of the walls has been completed. In other words, it may be 1-2 years before the windows are back in place.

While the drainage work is being done in the courtyard area, the Church Office entrance and the Chapel door may need to be temporarily closed due to construction. Please be on the lookout for church communications about how to enter the building during office hours, should this occur.

ATTIC SALE ANNOUNCEMENT

The planned work in and around the church building significantly impacts the logistics of the sale this year. As it is unclear when and how we might be able to collect donations and set up the sale, we will be taking a hiatus in 2024. Because the Attic Sale has been an important part of our fundraising mission, we are brainstorming for alternative events that might allow us to continue contributing to the many local charities who benefit from the proceeds of the sale.

CHRISTIAN ED DIRECTOR UPDATE

The Personnel Committee (Bill Bayer, Ashley Wood, and Rev. Crawford) and the chair of the Christian Education Committee (George Bollenbacher) have been actively engaged in the search for a new Christian Education Director to replace Lisa Niven, who concludes her employment on June 30th. The job responsibilities and hours of the position have been reduced from its current iteration, with the vast majority of time and energy to be devoted to the Sunday school ministry. The search process began in January: candidates were reviewed, Zoom interviews conducted, and one on-site interview took place. The committee is not moving forward with any of the candidates to date and has re-posted the position with the hopes of hiring someone to begin in August.

PEOPLE OF IPC
