Acts: Bible Study Guide

September 17 – October 22, 2023 led by Reuben Garcia

Based on renowned theologian N.T. Wright's popular Everyone Bible Study Guide, this class continues our look at how the work of Jesus Christ, through the Apostles, informs our Christian life and community today.
